

Utah County Fire Marshal

<u>Unincorporated Utah</u> <u>County</u> Outdoor Fires

Agricultural and Open Burning for yard cleanup require a burn permit. See <u>the Permit Applications & Requirements</u> on the fire marshal's web page: http://www.utahcounty.gov/Dept/Firemarshal/

Special Event Fires:

- A special use permit is required for larger events. Contact 801-851-8352. A special event or mass gathering permit will also be required by the; Utah County Public Works Office, Utah County Sheriff's Office, Utah County Health Department and the Utah County Fire Marshal's Office. *

 This kind of even may require Local Fire Department. Refer to your local City Fire Codes.
- Bond fire fuels may be no higher than 5 feet tall. No pallets or old lumber can be used.
- Reference to the International Fire Code and the UC ordinance Chapter 9 for more details.

Recreational fires located in Unincorporated Utah County are allowed and are subject to the following:

- Location on private property by the private property owner for a group size of less than 50 and family events or religious events only.
- Burning of trash or household garbage is not permitted.
- Shall not create a nuisance.
- Shall not be conducted when fire restrictions are in place. See www.utahfireinfo.gov.
- Shall not be conducted within 25 feet of a structure or combustible material.
- Constantly attended by the property owner or designee.
- Masonry or similar outdoor pits, fireplaces with chimneys above 6 feet are required to have a permit.
- Use the manufactured fire pit spark arrestors. Spark arrestors can be domed or flat. A Spark arrester shall be constructed of woven or welded wire screening of 12 USA standard gage wire (0.1046 inch) (2.66 mm) having openings not exceeding 1/2 inch (12.7 mm).
- Fuel load should be no higher than 3 feet wide by 1 foot high.
- Any Fire Chief, Fire Marshal or Fire Warden having jurisdiction, or their designee has the authority to extinguish unsafe fires.
- Fires in Urban-Wildland Interface (WUI) areas of Utah County are subject to additional restrictions.

Utah County ordinance regarding outdoor fires in the Wildland/Urban Interface Areas. 9-6-9. Outdoor Fires

(a) No person shall build, ignite or maintain any outdoor fire of any kind for any purpose in or on any Wildland-Urban Interface area, except by the authority of a written permit from the code official. *Exception 1:* Outdoor fires specifically allowed by any governmental agency having jurisdiction over the land.

Exception 2: (a) Outdoor fires <u>within inhabited premises</u> or designated campsites where such fires are in a permanent barbecue, portable barbeque, outdoor fireplace, incinerator or grill and are a <u>minimum of thirty</u> (30) feet from any combustible material or non-fire-resistive vegetation.

(b) No person shall use a permanent barbeque, portable barbeque, outdoor fireplace or grill for the disposal of rubbish, trash or combustible waste material.

- (c) Incinerators, outdoor fireplaces, permanent barbeques and grills shall not be built, installed or maintained in Wildland/Urban Interface areas without approval of the code official. <u>Openings in such appliances shall be provided with an approved spark arrestor, screen or door.</u>
- (d) The pile of fuel to be burned in the fire area for recreational fires shall not be larger than 3 feet in diameter and 1 foot high.
- (e) <u>A garden hose connected to a water supply</u> or other approved fire- extinguishing equipment shall be readily available for use at recreational fires.
- (f) Recreational fires are required to be <u>constantly attended</u> by a person knowledgeable in the use of the fire-extinguishing equipment. The attendant shall supervise the burning material until the fire has been extinguished. (Ord. 2015-2, 02-03-15).
- (g) Openings in fireplaces including fire pits shall be provided with an approved spark arrestor, screen or door. Fire pits shall have a flat or domed spark screen construction of woven or welded wire or approved metal and having openings not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ inch. (Ord. 2015-2,02-03-15; Ord. 2016-20, 7-12-16).
